Curriculum and Instructional Services

- C&I Department has been busy with planning support to YCOE programs and district partners for the upcoming school year (see attached PD flyer)
- Education Technology Specialist, Krista Purdom, has offered several Google Classroom trainings, in the last two weeks to support teachers in developing digital classrooms posting assignments, grading student work and adding extensions to make their classrooms more engaging and efficient. Trainings have been presented to teachers from YCOE Special Education, YCOE Alternative Education, Davis JUSD (attended training at YCOE) and Sacramento Valley Charter School (SVCS training at their site for all teachers)

SELPA


