YCOE Deputy Superintendent Office

- Deliver the Professional Learning Network face-to-face meeting on October 9 with next session scheduled for November 6 where Improvement Science tools will be introduced as a method to determine root causes of Problems of Practices as we prepare to dig deeper into dashboard results
- Define Differentiated Assistance Technical Assistance for the five school districts based on upcoming 2017
 Dashboard release and individual district support needs
- Conducted Yolo County School Board Association presentation on Dashboard and Differentiated Assistance
- Yolo/Solano Center for Teacher Credentialing awarded another 115 slots from the second round of the Classified
 School Employee Grant. Our partnership expanded this round to include Yuba COE and Napa COE.
- Human Resource Directors from Yolo school districts met for the first network meeting to address workforce
 needs. Executive Director Margie Valenzuela facilitated the meeting. Yolo County Careers in Education forum
 will take place on February 7 as part of our county-wide regional workforce outreach initiative.

- YCOE hosted an AB 1200 conference this week with participation from COEs throughout north and central California

College and Career Readiness

- Continuing the development of the charter petition in collaboration with YCOE departments, board and partners
- Adult Education Basic Grant support being provided to improve consortium effectiveness

Curriculum and Instructional Services

- Krista Purdom worked with students at CCCS-Woodland and West Sacramento to do STAR testing using the new Chromebooks. This provides baseline data on reading and math to assist teachers in targeting instruction.
- Head Start in-service on "Literacy All Day Every Day" (follow-up to "Math All Day, Every Day") presented by Maria Chairez and Deb Bruns on October 20.
- Winters Elementary School, "Introduction to NGSS" (Next Generation Science Standards), Deb Bruns, Saturday,
 October 21
- Maria Chairez is working with staff at Williams Primary Elementary School (Colusa County) to create an Early
 Literacy lab. She has been helping to set up the groups, materials, and formative assessment tools. The staff will
 be trained by Maria on Monday, Oct 23 and shortly thereafter the lab will begin serving students.

Early Childhood Services

- Raising A Reader Implemented
- Pre-service training on "Language and Literacy" on October 20th, Maria Chairez presented and our teachers loved it because she had lots of hands on activities.
- Conducted a Sacramento City College outreach to talk about our program and recruit teachers.
- IFSP (Individual Family Support Plan) Parent training will be provided through SELPA AT Lemen on November 7 and at Elkhorn on November 30
- Completed CLASS assessment and are in the process of writing detailed feedback so that teachers know where they need to focus.
- Self-Assessment is scheduled for October 31- November 14
- Suggestion boxes are installed in each classroom to receive feedback from both teachers and families. Monthly
 site visitations scheduled to collect the suggestions and bring it to key management to use for continuous
 program improvement

SOS

- Currently waiting on shipment of controls for the Prop 39 LED light retrofit at Plainfield, the installation will take place in the coming weeks.
- The conference center restroom will have new plumbing fixtures installed over the next week to help conserve water and help our water system keep up with large conferences.
- Lease is completed with Marquez Designs
- Maintenance Fun facts These numbers are as of October 5th:
 - 2,274 work orders completed in the last 12 months
 - o Currently floating around 200 work orders per month
 - o 78% of work orders are completed in less than a week (the top 20% of school districts who use School Dude as their work order system sit at 76%, median is 63%, lower 20% of districts is 46%)
 - 803 Preventative maintenance work orders have been generated over the last 12 months
 - Our ratio of Preventative Maintenance work orders to Corrective Maintenance work orders is 36% (the top 20% of school districts is 52%, median is 19%, the low 20% of districts is 4%)
 - Percentage of work orders completed in a month or less is 99% (top 20% of districts is 94%, median is 80%, the low 20% of districts is 53%)
- Conference Center Fun Facts
 - o In 2017 we have hosted 338 events as of October 5th
 - Weekend usage has almost doubled in the last year. 2016 usage was 125.5 hours, 2017 so far is 209.5 hours.
 - May had the highest usage at 47 events held, April had the least amount of events at 26.


Special Education
