### Yolo County Board of Education Update November 28, 2017

#### College and Career Readiness (CCR) - Director Lori Perez

- We were awarded two state CTE grants for Teacher Mentorship and development of a statewide Teacher Externship Toolkit total award is \$35,000
- Staff attended and presented at the state CTE conference on student workforce development opportunities and successful partnerships with industry partners.
- YCOE CCR Staff collaborated with the Yolo County District Attorney's Office and Victim Services and provided a Multi-Cultural Community Council 3-day Youth Leadership Academy serving 17 students.
- 29 students from Washington Unified attended a field trip to Sonoma State University over Thanksgiving Break.
   Karen Swan in the CCR department coordinated and led the field trip. Students learned about college opportunities and financial aid. The field trip was in partnership with YCOE C&I department and the City of West Sacramento

#### Curriculum and Instructional Services - Director Deb Bruns

#### • Literacy & English Language Development:

- Coaches from American Reading Company spent a day with Cesar Chavez and Dan Jacobs staff as part of the implementation of the American Reading Company program to engage and support students in independent reading.
- Maria Chairez presented a workshop on language development and literacy for Head Start staff at their November 17 in-service.

#### STEM/Educational Technology:

2nd Annual Yolo County STEM Girls Summit (November 7) 80 middle school girls from all 5 Yolo County school districts participated in hands-on workshops presented by UC Davis and Woodland Community College Science and Engineering students & faculty, USDA Genomics Project, GRID Alternatives Solar, Explorit Science Center and City of Woodland Maker Space. The students worked in small groups with students from several schools and high school mentors from Woodland HS and Cesar Chavez Community School. Presenters volunteered their time, school sites covered transportation and release time for teacher chaperones and a YCOE mini-grant covered food and material costs.

#### Science Support:

NGSS (Next Generation Science Standards) Framework Roll-out: C&I Director Deb Bruns and CCR Specialist Karen Swan both presented at the Rollout #4 at CSU Chico on November 14-15. Over 200 TK-12 teachers and administrators from Northern California attended the event organized in collaboration with CCSESA, CDE and WestEd/K-12 Alliance. Deb will be presenting at another roll-out event in Sacramento in May.

#### • Project SOLAR:

o River City HS Garden Solar & Wind Energy Installation - On November 17th RCHS students in the Engineering Academy worked with Strategic Energy Innovations and members of the local IBEW to install solar panels and a wind turbine in the school garden. The panels and turbine will power the tool shed and greenhouse, allowing students to grow crops year-round as part of their Community Supported Agriculture program. Andrew Tait, RCHS English teachers noted that "the solar/wind installation is unparalleled in West Sacramento's urban gardening scene. Hopefully, River City High School, Yolo County Office of Education and the City of West Sacramento can serve as a model of collaboration and the great things that happen when we all work together and live responsibly." The partnership was developed as one of YCOE's Project SOLAR Energy Academy projects.

#### Professional Development:

- How to Hold a Compliant IEP Meeting The target audiences were special education instructional staff and related services providers; and the instructors were Carolynne Beno and Lisa Young (Yolo SELPA Director & Program Specialist).
- Non-violent Crisis Intervention Training The target audiences were para professionals, general education teachers, and special education instructional staff; and the instructor were YCOE's Holly Alvis and Davis' Amy Higgins-Boyd (Behaviorists).
- Individual Family Service Plan (IFSP) Training The target audience was Early Head Start instructional staff members; and the instructors were YCOE's Jill Viramontes and Lisa Young (Yolo SELPA Program Specialist).
- Individualized Education Program (IEP) Goal Writing The target audiences were special education instructional staff and related services providers; and the instructor was Dr. Paula Gardner (Sacramento State University).
- **IEP Training** The target audience was Head Start instructional staff members; and the instructor was Carolynne Beno (Yolo SELPA Director).
- **IEP Training** The target audience was families in the Head Start program; and the instructors were Carolynne Beno and Lisa Young (Yolo SELPA Director & Program Specialist).
- **CAPTAIN Autism and Evidence Based Practices** The target audiences were special education instructional staff and related services providers; and the instructor was YCOE's Holly Alvis (Behaviorist).
- Behavioral Supports in the Classroom: Effective Reinforcement Strategies The target audience was para professionals; and the instructor was from the Northern California Diagnostic Center (a California Department of Education (CDE) Special School).

#### Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Professional Learning Network (PLN):

- Yolo SELPA Director Carolynne Beno has joined the PLN and attended the Improvement Science Training with Ronda DaRosa and Tami Ethier. Three improvement strategies (i.e., fishbone diagrams, empathy interviews, and process maps) were presented at the Improvement Science Training.
- These improvement strategies can be used to help understand problems of practice in our districts and each of these tools have been modeled and demoed with Yolo County's Special Educational Program Administrator Committee (PAC) to explore reasons for non-compliance on the districts' Annual Performance Reports (APR). For example, at our PAC meeting on November 15<sup>th</sup>, we investigated the problem of practice of low achievement for students who qualify for special education on the CAASPP math assessment using these tools. The intent is for districts to now use these tools with teams in their districts to discover the root causes of problems of practice and then action plan to improve.
- Carolynne Beno will be co-presenting with Lora Gonzalez (SELPA Director from Yuba County) at the PLN in December regarding each districts' APR, the ties between the APR and the LCAP, and on how the aforementioned improvement strategies can be used to understand problems of practice.

#### Student Services/Alternative Education – Assistant Superintendent Garth Lewis

- Secured funding from the California Endowment for the Yolo County African American Student Leadership Conference - Amount: \$15,000.00
- Attended a convening jointly sponsored by Senator Holly J. Mitchell and the Youth Law Center that was focused
  on court school operations and outcomes for youth. Participants represented various youth-serving sectors
  including education, public advocacy, philanthropic (foundations), community based organizations, faith-based
  organizations, and governmental. A related session is scheduled for January, 2018 and will focus on youth who

are involved in the justice system transitioning to community college. Yolo County will be represented at this event

It will be designed for smaller LEAs to assist them in implementing cyber security. Working together with districts and county offices the development of the framework will be distributed lightening the load on all and accelerating the process.
