- Continued support to districts with LCAP
- Conducting second differentiated assistance meetings with Washington and Esparto.
- Planning for NCCPLN April 9th meeting, focus on DIIUSP and Annual Update reviews

Alternative Education - Principal Gayelynn Gerhart

- Students working with Susan Shelton, Yolo Arts, have completed a ceramic garden art project with the students at Greengate School.
- Youth are working with Woodland Chavez staff from Yolo Arts to make 'friendship bracelets" for Yolo
 Arts to use in their thank you notes to acknowledge donations received during their Big Day of Giving
 in early May.
- Youth in YCCP will be building Friendship benches for Yolo Arts to donate to elementary schools in Yolo County.
- Individual 1:1 conferences have been held with youth at Dan Jacobs to update ILP's (Individual Learning Plans)
- Alternative Education youth have the opportunity to participate in a Museum of Tolerance fieldtrip (see attached flyer) ... April 23-25. All youth are invited to attend as long as they maintain the criteria outlined on the flyer.
- Woodland Chavez youth held a very special 17-minute remembrance on March 14 led by student leaders. Students stood in a circle together and read the names and a brief bio about the 17 victims of the Marjory Stoneman Douglass High School in Parkland, Florida school shooting. At the conclusion of the remembrance students gave out Choose Kindness bracelets.
- Students will be participating in the upcoming YES (Youth Empowerment Summit) on March 24 and the Cesar Chavez March on March 31 in Sacramento.
- We will be celebrating student success in the area of credits earned, attendance and improvement in the next couple of weeks.

Curriculum and Instruction, Director Deb Bruns

- February 27 Linking Language & Learning in Math, Day 2 (with Jack Dieckmann, Stanford University) Thirty
 math teachers and coaches came back for a second day, bringing with them student work and lessons learned
 from implementing the routines they learned during Day 1. The 2-day series is a collaboration between Placer
 COE and Yolo COE and part of a Region 3 Math workshop series.
- March 14, Tools to Support English Learners and Struggling Readers to Construct Written Responses, Kate
 Kinsella (sponsored by ASCD) Over 75 educators from throughout the region attended a one-day session
 focused on writing. We are pleased to have Dr. Kinsella back in the region and have planned an 8-day series for
 the fall.
- March 14-15, Region 3 Integrated Math & Science Community of Practice. All 5 districts in Yolo County sent
 representatives to this regional event for district "influencers". Keynote speakers, Harold Asturias, Center for
 Equity and Excellence in Mathematics Education, and Ryan Clark, Education Trust West, addressed the issue of
 equity and access. Participants experienced elementary lessons demonstrating the integration of math and
 science for equity. The group from Yolo County planned for how to bring this important work back to our
 districts. The second COP event will be hosted by YCOE in October 2018.
 - The C&I Team continues to provide support to YCOE programs in Literacy/ELD. Educational Technology and STEM:
- Deb Bruns led Head Start teachers in an exploration of STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) for pre-school students. Using the theme of water, teachers did hands-on explorations, designed investigations and planned for engineering challenges (boat making!).

- Yolo Arts Buddy Project During the weeks of March 5-19 Artist, Susan Shelton, from Yolo Arts and students from Cesar Chavez Community School have been working with our students making ceramic bugs to mount all over Greengate School and hand bowls for the students to take home It has been a great partnership and the students have had a great time working with clay and painting!
- Mike Jackson's SDC class for students with Autism has been working with our Music Therapist finishing a music video to the song "Happy" Can't wait to show you all!
- March 30 at 10:00 Spring Egg Hunt and Activities for our students /Adult Egg Hunt afterschool
- Wednesdays 9:30-11:00 PE Station Rotations with APE teacher, Beth Hogan, Trino and Students from Cesar Chavez Community School - We will be starting to get ready to participate in a Unified Track and Field Meet at Luther Burbank in May sponsored by Special Olympics (Greengate students and students from Cesar Chavez will compete together on a unified team - more info to come in April)

March:

In March the Yolo County SELPA is offering part two of an alternative dispute resolution training for administrators and service providers.
