Curriculum and Instruction, Director Deb Bruns

- Curriculum & Instruction Department welcomes new Administrative Secretary, Carmen Jojo.
- Environmental Literacy/CREEC: YCOE Awarded Two Grants!
 - YCOE was one of 5 regions awarded special one-time funding for two environmental literacy projects.
- NGSS, Gardens & Citizen Science: YCOE will work with Woodland JUSD, the UCD Center for Community & Citizen Science and Yolo Farm to Fork to host a summer institute for elementary teachers and after school staff to develop NGSS lessons that use the school gardens and engage students in "citizen science". Deb Bruns will also serve as the lead for the other 4 regions that have received funding for other "District Collaboration Environmental Literacy Workshops". (\$188,000 total funding received for 2 years).

- NGSS Environmental Phenomena Summit: YCOE will take the lead in hosting a "Phenomena Summit" in collaboration with the Sacramento Area Science Project (SASP) and SCOE. The goal of the summit is to bring together teachers and local scientists to identify local "phenomena" as the basis for developing NGSS lessons.
- Project SOLAR Field Trip: Thirty students from River City HS "Introduction to Green Technology" class visited the Sunpower R&D Ranch in Davis (home to the robots that clean the solar panels) and toured Grasslands Regional Park solar installation. While at Grasslands, students also had the opportunity to learn how to fly remote control gliders - taking advantage of the thermals created by the uneven heating of the earth's surface (another example of solar energy at work at the park!)
- The C&I Team continues to provide support to YCOE programs in Literacy/ELD. Educational Technology and STEM
 - Deb Bruns is working with Head Start teachers at Valley Oak to plan for "Friday STE(A)M Days" on May 11 & May 18th. Students will participate in hands-on explorations. Activities will be set up outside so that students can share what they learned with families at the end of the day.
 - Maria Chairez continues to ensure that all of our English Learners are tested and that our Alternative
 Education teachers have the resources to provide support to EL students. So far, one of our EL students has been reclassified. Testing continues through May.
 - Krista Purdom is busy coordinating state testing for all of our Alternative Education students.

College and Career Readiness (CCR) - Director Lori Perez

- Coordinated in partnership with Yolo County Election's Office, Woodland Public Library Teen Services, Woodland League of Women's Voters, UC Davis Early Academic Outreach Program, and Woodland Community College Admissions and Outreach the Yolo County Youth Empowerment Summit. Sixty-eight students from throughout Yolo County participated in a full-day workshop on 3/24 and engaged with 30 elected officials representing board of educations, city councils, and board of supervisors. Youth learned about voter rights, how to get involved in the community, and the role of elected officials.
- Supported 4 high school students who were youth speakers at the City of Woodland Cesar Chavez celebration. The students shared about Cesar Chavez's life and how his work impacted their lives.
- Submitted the Public Charter Schools Startup Grant applying for \$475,000 to assist with the opening of Yolo
 County Career Academy. Funds will assist with equipment, supply, and technology purchases to provide
 programming. We should hear in early May if we were funded.
- Supported college readiness field trip to Sac State for 18 Cesar Chavez Community School Students Woodland students on April 13.
- April 17th Administration of Justice Students participated in a crisis negotiations team training where the students role played in an active shooter and hostage scenario. Students learned about the process and were able to learn about various careers within law enforcement.
- April 20th Thomas Valles and Johnny Samaniego from McFarland USA came to Woodland to speak with our students at Woodland High School and visited Juvenile Hall and spoke with students in A,B, and C Pod. They shared their stories, what it meant to be resilient, and the impact that mentors plays on their lives. CW31 Good

Day Sacramento covered the event. Thomas has worked in the CA Department of Corrections and Rehab for 21 years and Johnny is a P.E. teacher at McFarland High School and took over Coach White's position when he retired.

- CCR staff is supporting Cesar Chavez Community School students in preparing resumes, applying for jobs, determining and signing up for college classes. Also connecting students who have WIOA hours remaining but no placements with companies and organizations where they can work to finish their hours, including YCOE's SOS department.
- Planned and supported curricular career exploration field trip to Sunpower and Sacramento Valley Soaring Society for River City High School Intro to Green Tech class.
- Piloted a leadership and urban forestry career exploration internship for 7 Washington Middle College High School students in partnership with Tree Davis' Trees for Tomorrow Program, which involves students learning about environmental justice and urban forestry, presenting lessons to elementary school students, and working with professionals to plant shade trees at local schools.
- Supported California ReLeaf and Tree Davis Arbor Day celebration, hosted at Washington Middle College High School March 7. CCR Staff organized a career panel and leveraged relationships with partner organizations to have staff from Cal Fire, PG&E, US Forest Service, City of Davis, City of West Sacramento and Tree Davis share advice and info with students about careers at their agency.

SELPA May Upcoming Events:

• Legislative Sharing Day: The Yolo County SELPA is taking 8 parents to participate in SELPA Legislative Sharing Day at the Capital on May 2nd. We will be meeting with Senator Dodd, an aide for Assemblyman McCarty, and with Assemblywoman Aguar-Curry to advocate for their support of:

AB 3136 (O'Donnell) Special education funding. AB 3136 would implement key fiscal recommendations, including addressing special education funding equity by:

- Leveling up base AB 602 funding rates to the 95th percentile
- Establishing funding within AB 602 for programs serving preschoolers with disabilities
- Amending the AB 602 formula to allow a declining enrollment adjustment based on district average daily attendance (ADA) instead of aggregated SELPA ADA.
- Providing additional funding for students with significant high-cost disabilities.

AB 2704 (O'Donnell) Special education programs: Family Empowerment Centers on Disability. AB 2704 would provide the following:

- Revise the base grant for FECs from \$150,000 to \$223,000
- Prioritize creation of new FECs in areas of high need
- Improve coordination between California Department of Education and FECs by developing a uniform and rigorous data collection, monitoring and reporting system.
