Restoration

- Revegetation with native plants
- Assistance to creek side landowners for habitat preservation and restoration projects
- Assistance to Yolo County to implement the Cache Creek Resources Management Plan

Management

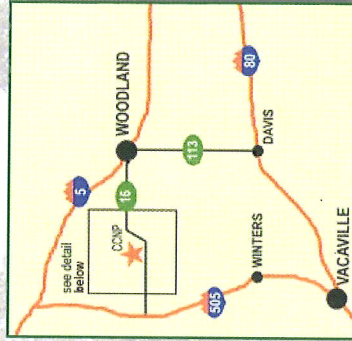
