**Resolution #20-21/17
Upholding Democracy and Security for Schools and Society**

WHEREAS, on January 6, 2021, our nation witnessed violence and terrorism at our Nation’s Capitol, causing destruction, injury, and death; and

WHEREAS, it was horrific to witness violence and domestic terrorism, broadcasted live around the globe; and

WHEREAS, the Yolo County Office of Education denounces racism and white supremacy, and supports the equity, well-being and public safety of Native, Black, and People of Color -- including #BlackLivesMatter members -- who demand solutions to an exacerbation of structural inequities, especially during the Covid-19 pandemic; and

WHEREAS, force was incited against elected leaders, including those that support educational policy, including Ethnic Studies; and

WHEREAS, presidential and school leaders took an oath to uphold the constitution and protect the nation; and

WHEREAS, it is important to uphold democracy to prevent a danger in schools, society, and around the world; and

WHEREAS, the terrorism and violence that occurred also serves as a reminder of the dire need for Ethnic Studies and Civic Education, because if we do not develop anti-racist consciousness with and for our youth, white supremacy ideology will persist; and

WHEREAS, as a county board of education, we must continue to model for our students what leading with integrity, collaboration, ethics, respect, and anti-racism looks like; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Yolo County Office of Education hereby condemns violent, destructive and treasonous acts against the United States of America, the United States Congress and the Constitution of the United States. We urge for a defense of our democracy across all institutions.
