1.4 Public Comment.

Juliette Beck commented on a climate emergency resolution.

Good afternoon. Thank you to the trustees for continuing all the work you have done during COVID. It has been quite a year and I am reaching out on behalf of a coalition working on the climate emergency, and unfortunately I am here to say while there is a pandemic to deal with now, the long term emergency of the climate is still incredibly urgent. I am also pleased to say that the Yolo County Board of Supervisors is creating an advisory body to work on addressing the climate emergency. We wanted to reach out and make sure you received copy of a resolution passed in September to bring your attention and awareness to send a rep to participate in the advisory body, and wanted to bring this to your attention. I'm also a big advocate of going back to schools outdoors, where the spread of COVID and the risk is much reduced. There are schools in Vermont that are outdoors and schools in Yolo that are private like Waldorf that have shown that kids can be educated outdoors. It has led to a disparity in who has had access to education and who hasn't in the district. I encourage the Yolo County Board of Education to develop some suggestions/standards and support for teachers and schools and districts in the county to return to schools outdoors and to do it safely and develop some protocols and guidance. I would be happy to follow up and share some suggestions I shared with Davis Joint USD and use the ethnic studies framework to help us return to school with the sensitivity around the disparate impacts of covid and collective well-being and health. Thank you and I appreciate the opportunity. Grateful for the work of the teachers and principal at Cesar Chavez school and also recommended that YCOE and districts utilize the Cesar Chavez School model curriculum at the California Department of Education (CDE).

Trustee Zendejas commented on his first year as a trustee at Woodland Joint Unified School District and a dinner he had with Dr. Cirenio Rodriguez and Cesar Chavez's daughter where he heard stories about Cesar Chavez that were very impactful on his life. Dr. Carolynne Beno, Associate Superintendent, Educational Services reviewed the PowerPoint, *YCOE Update in Reopening for In-Person Instruction*, in the Board packet and responded to questions from the Board.

- Trustee Jimenez asked about available Personal Protective Equipment (PPE for staff. Staff stated that PPE has been distributed to all schools.
- Trustee Moreno asked if teachers have agreed to go back to classroom even without vaccination. All unions have agreed to go back per agreements according to Superintendent Lewis.

Other questions from Vice President Moreno included

- Condition of air and ventilation systems.
- Is teaching outside an option. Has there been parent interest in this.
- Have there been parent training in Spanish.
 - How many Spanish speaking parents are able to participate in training.
- Have new COVID-19 variants in county been taken into account in regards to reopening schools.

Dr. Beno stated that we have agreements with labor unions to return and they will receive training. New guidance will provide training on these issues before we reopen. Receiving the vaccine is not a condition for staff to return. Ms. Huey commented on the air and ventilation systems and changes that have been made dependent on the site. She also commented on the different systems being used at those sites.

Dr. Beno stated that parent training is available in Spanish and English and parents have the opportunity to visit the sites. Currently we do not have outdoor facilities available for teaching outside especially for special education needs but kids will have the opportunity to play outside. She also commented on mask use during class at this time and stated that we are not testing students. The parents are responsible for screening students.

The timeline on opening for schools have been different for each county. Vice President Moreno stated it would helpful in the future to have the data on schools that have had successful re-openings. The new COVID-19 variants have been discussed during the public county health department updates.

Trustee Souza Cole also would like to receive more data in the future on the successful reopening of schools. She commented on the access to vaccinations and had a question on testing protocol and test rates per county. Dr. Beno stated we may have to pivot in the future on testing students, staff, etc. but currently we are moving forward and focusing on training staff on reopening schools.
